Third EVkids Tutoring site opens, expanding opportunities for more youth!

New Roxbury location is convenient to students' homes and Northeastern University

Thanks to you, EVkids has now opened a third Tutoring site!

Site Director Jenn Bufithis-Hurie and long-time Program Director Lauren Ravello are spearheading the new third site, hosted at the Dewitt Community Center in Roxbury. The 2018-19 school year is the first in a three-year rollout, starting with 15 tutor-tutee pairs and growing to 40 pairs by 2020-21 -- in addition to the 80 pairs supported at the two Dorchester sites!

Like at the first two sites, most

tutees fall into one of two categories. The first group is made up of kids who know they want to go far, but they don't quite know how to get there.

The second group are kids who don't yet know what they are capable of. Bradley is in this group, a 6th grader who is trying to simply get a foothold when everything around him is new, and probably scary. Bradley moved to the U.S. from Haiti just six months ago, and now lives with his aunt and cousins. In school, he is an English Language Learner, receiving special help to learn his second language, English. He is shy and quiet, with a passion for playing soccer. His aunt is among the many who know how important it is for Bradley to have the attention of a trained, supported, committed 1-on-1 tutor to meet with week after week.

"I think having a tutor who spends time focusing on him will help bring Bradley out of his shell," Jenn said after meeting him.

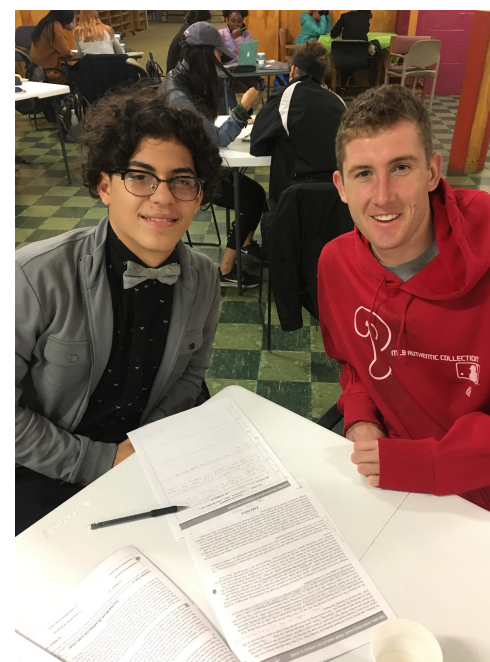
To support the new Dewitt site, EVkids is recruiting tutors from even more universities through new campus partnerships. So far this year, tutors come from Harvard, Boston College, Tufts, Lesley, Boston University, Northeastern, Emmanuel College, and
