At EVkids, our 1-on-1 support system of academic mentoring, family engagement, and school advocacy empowers our students to pursue their education and achieve their goals.

86% of EVkids seniors attained on-time high school diplomas



76% of students of color nationally attain a high school diploma on time

86% of EVkids seniors enrolled in college after high school



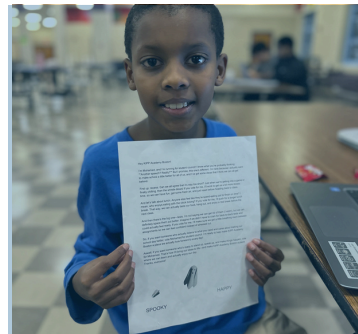
56% of low-income students nationally enroll in college after high school

91% of EVkids college students are on track to graduate on time



40% of college students of color in a four-year program nationally graduate on time

Mohamed, a fifth-grader attending Tutoring at Harbor Point, has political ambitions and, despite some worries, he couldn't resist running when he was nominated for student council at his school, KIPP Academy Boston. Each week, he updated EVkids Site Director Jess Smith about the progress of his campaign: first, preparing a speech; then, reporting that it went well.

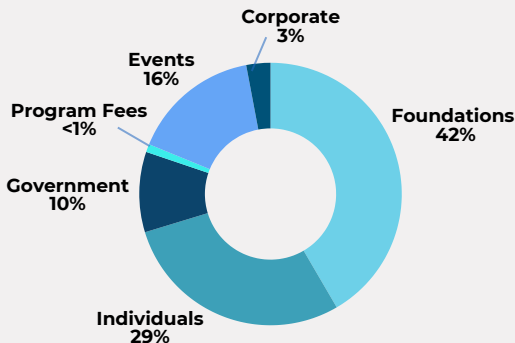

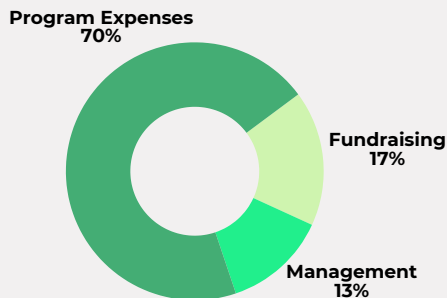
