EVKIDS ADVANCING EDUCATION

At EVkids, our 1-on-1 support system of academic mentoring, family engagement, and school advocacy empowers our students to pursue their education and achieve their goals.

100% of EVkids seniors attained on-time high school diplomas



76% of BIPOC students nationally attain a high school diploma on time

100% of EVkids seniors enrolled in college after high school



56% of low-income students nationally enroll in college after high school

100% of EVkids college students are on track to graduate on time



40% of BIPOC college students nationally in a four-year program graduate on time

This transition has further solidified their bond and introduced them to new experiences. At the end of weekly Tutoring sessions, Arik has been teaching Ibrahim how to play chess, and in a thrilling match, Ibrahim recently almost bested Arik. Their time spent playing chess has evolved into a cherished moment for both, illustrating how simple activities, like chess, can fortify the trust between a mentee and their mentor, leading to higher-quality educational time together.

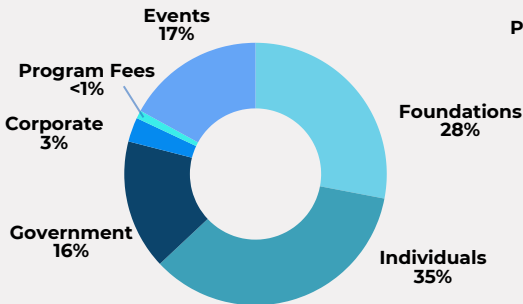

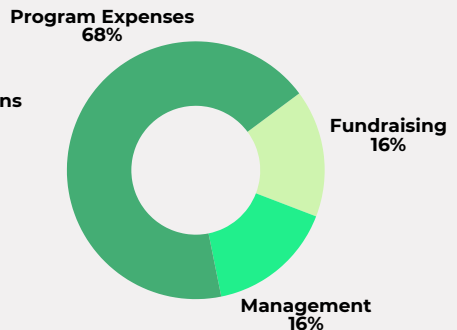
